Grammar -add prefixes and suffixes:

Poetry

Children will continue to write a range of sentence types (statements, commands, questions and exclamations). They will use an increasing range of punctuation such as capital letters, full stops, question and exclamation marks, commas and apostrophes. Spellings will be taken from the National Curriculum lists for Year 1 and Year 2.

Maths

Times tables will continue daily through practical games, chants and movement. Times Tables Rock Stars will also be used to test the children each week.

Children will also focus on developing quick mental recall of basic number facts such as number bonds, doubles and halves.

The four operations beginning with multiplication and division will be a focus leading to problem solving.

Describing position, direction and movement including whole, half, quarter and three quarter turns/angles. Year 2 will also look at right angles.

Science

Animals including Humans - the children will learn that all animals, including humans, have offspring which grow into adults. They will learn about the basic needs of animals and understand the importance of healthy eating, exercise and hygiene.

Art/DT

The children will learn about the work of the Mexican artist Frida Kahlo and create self portraits.

They will consider works from different cultures and using wool will learn to weave to create Ojo de Dios (God's eyes).

ICT

The children will use technology to create a Power Point presentation about Mexico.

They will use a data software programme to collate and present information about football.



Let's Get Moving

Music

Using Sing Up the children will learn a repertoire of chants and rhymes, linked to countries' anthems. They will play tuned and un-tuned instruments following musical notation. The children will compare music from different countries.

Geography

As we follow the World Cup this half of term, our chosen focus country is Mexico. The children will compare Mexico and the UK and look at physical and human features of the locality, making geographical comparisons to our own locality using maps and secondary sources.



PSHE

Linked to our values and those of the Paralympics the children will learn about determination, respect, courage, equality and inspiration.

PE

This half term the children take part in striking and field games (with Mrs Owen).

As part of our Let's Get Moving Topic they will also learn the Mexican Hat Dance and perform this on Sports Day (Mrs Medland).

RE

The children will learn why we have rules and routines in our everyday life and will go on to learn about the importance of rules and routines from the viewpoint of different religions including Christianity and Judaism. In Judaism they will learn about the Shabbat.
